



What is TIP?

- TIP stands for "Talent Identification Program."
 - The first TIP program started in 1972.
 - The Baylor TIP program started in 2021.
- The goal of TIP is to identify gifted youth and provide them with advanced academic opportunities.

What are the benefits of participating?

- Recognition as a TIP Scholar!
- Invitations to participate in advanced academic programs.
- Attention from recruiters from top universities.
- A jump start on preparation for college admissions exams.
- Review and solidification of math and language skills.

How can students participate?

- Districts/schools can enroll their students into the program.
- Students/parents can enroll individual students.

How does one become a Baylor TIP scholar?

- Students must take the College Readiness Assessment (CRA) or the Indicator of Academic Readiness (IAR) exam (or the 8/9 versions for younger students).
- Students will qualify as a Baylor TIP scholar based on multiple factors, including their CRA or IAR scores, recommendations, and potential.
